o Albany and Dougherty County Plans, Ordinances & Regulations

All development in the 100-year floodplain and floodway must follow floodplain regulations and requires a permit. Development in regulated wetlands is prohibited unless a Nationwide Permit from the Army Corps has been issued. Development includes construction, renovation, accessory structures, fill, excavation, and grading.
